### Measuring our success

At LifeQuest, three ways we evaluate our success is through enrollment, member satisfaction, and financial support—all of which reflect the strength of our organization.

#### **ENROLLMENT**

In 2024, a total of 2,088 participants enrolled in classes. Each term's enrollment numbers exceeded expectations, achieving the highest participation since the pandemic. In fact, last summer's enrollment hit an all-time record! We're looking forward to this upward trend continuing in 2025.


### **MEMBER SATISFACTION**

Last spring, our members shared their feedback in a survey. When asked, "How satisfied are you overall?" respondents gave LifeQuest an impressive 4.6 out of 5 score. ### **FINANCIAL SUPPORT**

LifeQuest members supported the end of the year "nuts and bolts" appeal by raising an amazing \$19,510 which will support many program improvements in 2025.



### **Supporting Congregations**

LifeQuest of Arkansas began in 1981 as Shepherd's Center of Little Rock. The Shepherd's Centers of America originated in 1972 in Kansas City, Missouri, by a group of faith leaders who wished to improve the lives of the older adults. Inspired by the mission of Shepherd's Centers, W. "Jay" Jernigan, Jr. brought the concept to his congregation at Second Presbyterian Church in Little Rock. With the help of 14 area congregations and the Presbytery of Arkansas, the Shepherd's Center of Little Rock opened its doors on October 7, 1981. The vision behind the dream had been realized! An interfaith, ecumenical "mutual ministry" for older people in the community had become a reality.

Shepherd's Centers of America celebrated 50 years in 2024 and commemorated the milestone with new branding and a new name: Aging Forward. While our organization's name changed to LifeQuest of Arkansas in 2003, LifeQuest continues to be a proud member of the Aging Forward alliance. 


